The Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time October 25, 2015



A few months ago our parishioner, Mike Cincotta, mentioned to me that Emmanuel Presbyterian in Whippany was closed last year and their building is going to be demolished soon. He encouraged me to take a look at their pipe organ, because they were giving it away. We paid a visit to play the organ with its pastor, Rev. Howard Currie and I was astounded by the beauty of its sound. I also realized that this organ and its pipes would fit perfectly on the left side of our choir loft, but it would require a full restoration to move it from that church to St. Rose. It has 10 ranks of pipes, including chimes and trumpets for a grandiose sound and a two-manual console.

Father Owen was instrumental in facilitating the acquisition and all phases of planning this project. Churches spend hundreds of thousands of dollars building organs, which when cared for, will last generations. Once installed, this organ is going to be worth around \$100,000.00, but because we don't have to pay for the pipes and console, it will cost only a third of that amount to rebuild it. We have chosen the well known organ builders and restorers, the Peragallo Company, to install our new organ.

I have a dear friend Jan Kennedy who originally comes from Short Hills who has been a wonderful benefactor to this parish for many years. Matthew and I were thrilled when she gave us a check for the entire cost in memory of her beloved mother Corinne.

Our RCIA sessions have begun. We have a wonderful group of people. We have three Protestants who seek entry into the Catholic Church, two Catholics who need First Holy Communion and Confirmation, and three Catholics who need Confirmation. If you know of any other people who would like to be baptized Catholic, Protestants who would like to convert or Catholics who would like to receive Holy Communion or Confirmation, please contact Fr. Matthew or me.

A big thank you to Deacon Vin and Peggy for coordinating Bishop's Annual Appeal again this year. Thanks to everyone in our parish who has prayerfully sacrificed to this most worthwhile endeavor.

The loss of a loved one is an incredibly painful time in our lives but it's very important to get the help and support to try and live a joyful, hopeful life be it in a different way. We start our bereavement series on Wednesday, October 28th at 7:00pm in the parish offices. News From Rome

It is incredible living so close to everything that we read about in Catholic newspapers. Just the other day Cardinal Wuerl, the Archbishop of Washington and one of the participants in the Synod on the Family celebrated Mass for us and is staying with us at the College. He is not the only one since most if not all of the American participants are staying with us and head off every morning to discuss this important issue. It is such an honor to be in the presence of these men who will help to mold the future of our Church in the advice they will give to Pope Francis. I encourage all of you to follow what is happening, but be careful with much of the news you hear, since many news sources are not experts in regards to Church matters. If you are looking for a good site to read I recommend looking at news.via the official website of the Vatican. It will help you avoid all of the misinterpretation that sometimes can happen.

I must say it was incredible to witness the canonization of two new French saints, St. Marie-Azelie Guerin Martin and St. Louis Martin, her husband. These two saints were the parents of St. Therese of Lisieux and are great examples of encouraging vocations. They had 9 children all together, but only 5 daughters grew up to be adults; all became nuns. It is an incredible story to hear, but reminds us the need to always pray for vocations especially from our own families. So as I close this week, please pray for the Church in France from where these great saints came from, that she may see an increase in vocations and in Mass attendance. Pray also for an increase of vocations to both religious life and the priesthood from within your own families, especially following in the example of St. Therese's parents. We are blessed to many missionaries coming to serve our Diocese, like Fr. Matthew. We must first and foremost seek to encourage vocations from our own sons and daughters.
