The gift of priesthood is a very special gift from God. I'm very grateful to God for the gift of my priesthood. In a busy parish like ours the priest literally is in contact with every aspect of life; marriage prep, baptisms, education, sacramental life, illness, death, and the bereaved. None of us have any control over how old we are when we die but we have every control over how we live. As a priest I celebrate the sacraments and give God strength to His people so we can be holy and blameless in His sight.

For many years I have fostered the priesthood among many men. We all remember particularly, Fr. Hubert, who came to us as a newly ordained deacon. This past summer we had the pleasure of having Andrew with us for ten weeks. Now we have Michael who will come to us for Thanksgiving, Christmas and holiday weekends. Alex of course, a son of our parish, is of special pride to all of us. The role of the pastor in particular is to mentor young men so that they will be properly prepared to lead parishes in the future. He must teach them to be holy men of God, full of confidence, and able to stand up to public opinion when necessary. As a priest, our hands are anointed with holy oils. Our hands heal the sick, prepare the dying, baptize the child or adult and bring hope and consolation to those in need.

The road to priesthood is a hard and arduous journey. It takes between six and eight years and each young man is pushed towards a sense of spirituality with academic excellence. In the early years of seminary it can be quite lonely as the young man must distance himself from his family and focus on studies that prepare him to serve the people of God. The North American College is a major seminary which was built and financed by the bishops and Catholics of the United States. It is the biggest seminary in the city of Rome. It presently houses 250 students from all over the United States with a few Canadians and Australians. This seminary is in the Vatican City and is a testament to the faith of the American people in the universal Church. I made a quick trip to the North American College in Rome at the end of October to visit with our diocesan seminarians. How proud I am of their dedication to work. They begin each day at Mass at 6:10am, walk forty minutes to the Gregorian University, take studies in Italian, and then return to the NAC for further studies and spiritual formation. Please keep our young men Alex, Andrew, Caesar, and John in prayer during these important years of formation. You'll be pleased to know that Alex and Andrew send their best wishes to you all and are happy and doing very well in their formation.

While in Rome I had the privilege of celebrating Mass on my birthday at the side altar of St. Michael the Archangel at St. Peter's Basilica. We visited the beautiful Province of Abruzzo. The beautiful fall colors, the mountains, the lovely basilica and of course the food, were a joy to behold. I had a short retreat at the Monastery of Greccio and in that beautiful holy mountainside monastery I gave God thanks for my life and prayed to be able to continue to be the shepherd God calls me to be.

Last Tuesday evening, I celebrated Mass for all those who were buried from our parish this past year. It was an emotional Mass for all of us especially when the name of the deceased was called and the family members brought up a lit candle to the altar. We know that our beloved dead have moved on to the glory of God and we pray that each of us will brighten God's world with love, faith, and hope.

During this month of November it is traditional that all Catholics pray for their beloved dead. Be sure to leave your list of names in the collection basket so that we can place them with the names of our beloved dead on the altar.

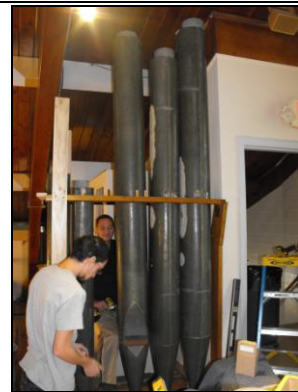
