Epiphany Of The Lord January 3, 2016



As we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany we call to mind God's invitation through the Baby Jesus to all people. Jesus came on earth to set all people free from sin. The Jewish people were the first to form a covenant with God. However, at the crib scene we see the local Jewish shepherds and the Three Kings who were Gentile (pagan).

These Three Kings travelled afar and made preparations to enter a foreign land because they understood a royal king was about to be born. This royal king however, saw no boundaries and His birth brought to be a time when Greek and Jew, slave and free, could freely enter a covenant with God but the new covenant was a relationship of love, justice and peace. Through Christ, our relationship with God is never founded on fear but rather on the love we have for God and our wanting despite our human nature to rise with Christ in holiness. Life at times can be a messy business. We can meet unpleasant people, difficult situations and when we do, let's consider the Three Kings in their ornate golden robes kneeling on the stable ground. They weren't worried about their clothes being soiled, their souls were pure, their intention holy. When we try to combat life's problems, difficulties and challenges, let's strive with pure hearts to bring the strong, courageous love of Christ to situations which without our trust in Christ would be impossible to deal with. As I sing the Irish Blessing for special occasions, I always consider we reach out with our human hand to the divine hand of Christ, to be led with love and courage on the path of righteousness. The Three Kings found the Baby Jesus in obscurity and they worshipped Him. We know Jesus is everywhere. May our lives be a reflection of the strength, hope and courage that is ours as Catholic Christians.

Next week as we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, let's take some time out to reflect upon our own Baptismal promises and ask ourselves "Am I living the life God invites me to live?"

It's been such a joy and blessing to have Fr. Matthew as our Vicar. Since July and until next June this will be a year of firsts for him - his first Masses, his first wedding, first confessions during the Advent Season, his first Christmas Masses as a priest. He is so excited by it all and that excitement is contagious. The children in the Academy love him and look forward to his funny and thought inspiring homilies. We tease each other a lot but I'm sure it's obvious how fond I am of him and how pleased I am to have him at St. Rose.

Seminarian Michael has been with us since December 5th. He returns to Holy Apostle Seminary in Connecticut January 17th. He spent his first Easter with other seminarians at St. Rose. Little did he know that the Holy Spirit and the Bishop would appoint him to our parish and that was immediately following Andrew's departure in September. He spent his first American Christmas with us and loved every minute of it. He worked hard and is really enjoying getting to know our parishioners. Fr. Matthew and I are very pleased with Michael's work and as you can hear, by his reading at Mass, his English is improving every day.

As we begin this New Year of 2016, on behalf of Fr. Matthew, I wish you a Holy and Happy New Year.

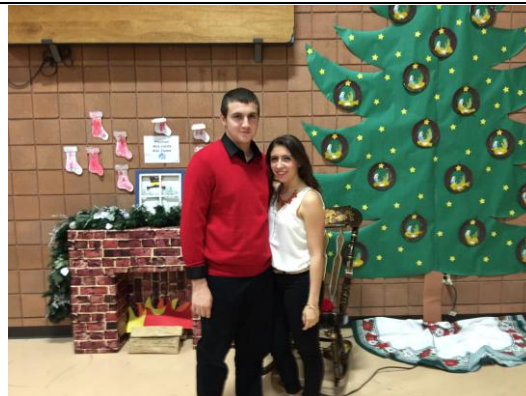
