How blessed we are having Pope Francis as our pope during these changing and difficult times. I'm always thrilled and excited when non-Catholics speak about him in such glowing terms and indicate that he too is a leader to many Christians. The pope really has his finger on the pulse of humankind. He knows our joys, our sorrows, our weakness and our strength. He reminds us constantly that we must be merciful as the Father is merciful.

We're blessed also in the leadership of Bishop Arthur Serratelli. Knowing the bishop very well, I'm always amazed at how he always keeps such a busy schedule and spends considerable amounts of time meeting and greeting the Catholics of our diocese in the counties of Morris, Sussex and Passaic that make up the Paterson Diocese. In our diocese we have many beautiful areas:

- Suburban towns that range from being affluent to towns that are middle class and financially strong.
- Rural towns grappling with unemployment and declining population.
- Urban cities primarily populated with the working poor struggling to survive due to rising rents and living costs.

This weekend I will speak at all of the Masses to thank you for last year's generous contribution to Bishop's Annual Appeal and to outline for you, this year's Appeal.

Last spring I taught 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade in the Academy. We spent about two weeks budgeting for a fictitious family. The dad worked sixty hours a week at minimum wage. The mom worked thirty hours a week also at minimum wage. They had two children. At the end of the month the family who rented a small apartment, owned a used car, and had one cell phone and basic cable were in the red. They went to the St. Rose food pantry twice a month to stretch out their tight budget. Our students were shocked to see how difficult it was for a family on limited means to make ends meet.

Bishop's Appeal, through Catholic Charities, helps families throughout our diocese to find the help and support they need during times of struggle. We support the working poor to help make ends meet. We provide support for people who suffer from drug and alcohol abuse. We support working adults who desperately need day care for dependant elderly parents and elderly family members. We support the diocesan food pantries which are frequently depleted of non-perishable foods. In essence, my dear friends, we reach out to those most in need with the arms of Christ, the heart of Christ, the compassion of Christ. Please prayerfully consider how you can represent Christ and give hope to those who are in need.

Here at St. Rose we are privileged to have Fr. Matthew as our Vicar. I am privileged to mentor Deacon Michal, Deacon Andrew, Alex, and Kamil. Each of these young men have been beneficiaries of Bishop's Annual Appeal. We have and will continue to provide excellent seminarian education so that the future priests of our diocese will be well educated and prepared to serve us in the future.

Bishop's Appeal also helps struggling inner city schools and provides help for elderly priests who reside in Nazareth Village and who are unable for one reason or another to live independently.
