## *Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord April 9, 2017*



On this Palm Sunday weekend we begin the holiest week of the year. Our holy liturgies of the Triduum help us to relive the Mass of the Lord's Supper, to help us suffer with Christ in the Passion and to rejoice with Christ in His glorious resurrection.

The Triduum incorporates Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Holy Saturday Vigil:

- Mass of the Lord's Supper includes the washing of the feet of the disciples and the remembering of the institution of the Holy Eucharist.
- The Good Friday proclamation of the Passion, Veneration of the Cross and receiving of Holy Communion helps us to realize Jesus is suffering for us. The gift of Holy Communion reminds us that we are people of the resurrection. The evening Stations of the Cross help us to walk with Christ through joy, sorrow, suffering, death and resurrection.
- On Holy Saturday, the lighting of the Paschal Fire, the procession with the new Easter candle leading into the joyful celebration of the Vigil Mass of Easter.

I encourage you, our parishioners, to try to come to the liturgies for Holy Thursday 7:00pm, Good Friday 3:00pm, Living Stations of the Cross 7:00pm, and the Vigil of Holy Saturday 7:30pm. As you are aware, no Mass is allowed on Holy Thursday morning except for the Mass of the Lord's Supper. No Mass is allowed on Good Friday. The faithful receive Holy Communion, which has been consecrated the night before, during the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion. No Mass is allowed on Holy Saturday except for the Vigil Mass which must be celebrated after sunset.

On Holy Thursday morning, Good Friday morning and Holy Saturday morning Deacon Vinny will lead the faithful in Morning Prayer at 9:00am. Please see a brief explanation of these liturgies on page three of this weekend's bulletin. Deacon Michal, following the beautiful Polish tradition, will bless the Easter food on Holy Saturday in the school foyer at 11:00am. Please note next weekend our Easter Mass schedule will be: Saturday Easter Vigil Mass celebrated at 7:30pm, our Sunday Masses will be celebrated at 7:30am, 9:00am, 10:30am and 12:15pm. Remember there will be no 7:00pm Mass on Easter Sunday.

I'm very proud of our Youth Ministry team who, with the help of some younger brothers and sisters and under the direction of Lisa Paradiso, will present a beautiful and prayerful Living Stations of the Cross experience. This is a great way for people who have to work to come and worship Jesus, feel His pain and know His love for us. Also, many people who come to the 3:00pm liturgy also attend the 7:00pm Stations of the Cross and in so doing walk the way of the cross with Jesus and to prepare their minds and hearts for the glory of the Resurrection.

As is our tradition, we will celebrate a holy hour on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 23<sup>rd</sup> from 2:15pm – 3:15pm in the church. Deacon Michal will preside at the liturgy and during that time I will be available in the Quiet Room for Confession.

Thanks to everyone who joined me in supporting the Holy Family Hospital in Bethlehem as our Lenten sacrifice. As you know, our second collection this weekend was to collect the sacrificial offering of our parishioners. Thanks to all who gave to the collection in advance and for those who are contributing this weekend. For those of you who want to give and haven't done so yet, you can either place it in a sealed envelope in the collection basket marked Holy Family Bethlehem or mail it directly to Holy Family Hospital of Bethlehem Foundation, 2000 P Street, N.W., Suite 310, Washington, D.C. 20036.

## LENTEN REGULATIONS

### Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of FAST and ABSTINENCE:

Those between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-nine (59) are obliged to fast, which means that only one full meal is taken on a day of fasting and no meat is to be eaten.

### FRIDAYS of Lent are also days of ABSTINENCE:

The law of abstinence requires that no meat be eaten on a day of abstinence.

### Easter Duty:

Is the reception of the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist. To fulfill this obligation the time period is from the First Sunday in Lent (March 5) to Trinity Sunday (June 11th).



Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday are the days called the Triduum. These Holy Days lead us from the remembering of the institution of the priesthood and the Holy Eucharist. This leads us into the sorrow and pain of Christ's suffering and death on Good Friday. Easter Saturday morning begins bleakly, but ends with the joy of the risen Lord.

### GOOD FRIDAY

No 9:00am Mass – Morning Prayer

On this solemn day of Good Friday at 3:00pm is the reading of the Lord's Passion, the Veneration of the Cross and reception of Holy Communion.



At 7:00PM join us as the members of the Youth Ministry led by Ms. Lisa Paradiso, perform the Living Stations of the Cross in the Church.

Experience the love Christ has for us in this beautiful dramatized liturgy.

No 9:00am Mass - Morning Prayer

On Holy Saturday morning at 11:00am, come to the school foyer where Deacon Michal will bless the Easter food.

At 7:30pm, we gather together for the mother of all vigils "The Easter Vigil." We begin the liturgy with the lighting of the Paschal Fire.

The newly lit Paschal Candle is carried into the Church. The Easter light of Christ comes among us.

During this liturgy adults are baptized, receive First Holy Communion and Confirmation. Our Liturgy is resplendent with liturgical music, psalms and praise.

## NEWS FROM ROME

Happy Palm Sunday! I pray that everyone has been having a great lent and enjoying the new spring weather. I am restarting my column of News from Rome after a small break due to all the different studies. Lent in Rome is a great time to be on a mini pilgrimage every day. This is because we take part in the ancient tradition of Station Churches. Mass is held in a different Church around Rome, so every morning, you go on a "pilgrimage" to get there and to pray with the same community, with the same God, but in a new edifice.

I also wanted to make sure to thank all the children from our religious education program who have sent me letters wishing me a "Buona Pasqua." I think everyone in East Hanover learned Italian, or somebody helped them. It is always uplifting to hear of the prayers from back home, and I want to answer some of the questions that were asked. I have learned many new things since I have been in Rome, especially about the history of the Church, there's 2000 years of events, so it's a lot to remember, but I love studying and learning more about God and I have been getting good grades. However, this is because I study hard and have your prayers to help me. I have also met many new people here, and two of my good friends are from Texas and Boston, who would have guessed. And while some of you asked me is it hard to be a priest, if you try to do it on your own, it is impossible, but if you depend on God and trust Him entirely, nothing is impossible. That is why even if it might seem difficult or scary to give your life to God, if you pray and trust in Him, there is no fear.

Some more of the questions were about Rome. So things here in Rome are lovely and spring time has arrived, it is about 75°F in the day, but a little chilly in the morning. It has been a great privilege to study and live here and I have really transitioned well into Italian culture, although I do miss home. It is tourist season, so the streets are filled with groups of people from all over the world, coming together to see the Pope and walk the same streets that the Saints did before. The final question is about school, so things here are different from the US since school is first of all in Italian. Moreover, unlike school in the US, there are not tests, quizzes, or papers; I just have one final oral exam, where I sit with the professor for 15 minutes, and that is my grade. It can be a little nerve wracking, but again prayer and trusting God is most important.

Know that I keep you all close to my heart in prayer and I ask you do the same. I don't know where I will be assigned this summer, but I know that St. Rose will be one of my first visits. I look forward to keeping up with you all again through my column and I wish you a prayerful Holy Week.

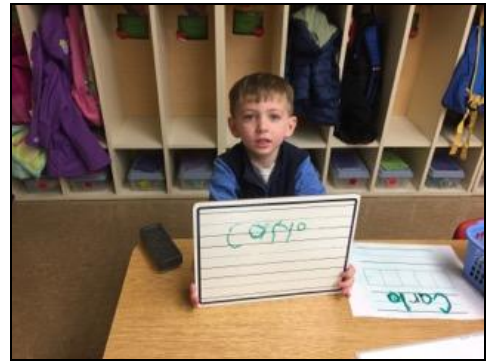
Most of us guessed the water would turn colors, and that was correct! What we didn't expect was for the jelly bean to become almost translucent!

## SACRAMENTS

### Baptism

We celebrate the sacrament of Baptism most Sundays. Parents are welcome to have the Baptism celebrated either at a week-end Mass or at the Liturgy of Baptism at 1:15. To make arrangements for Baptism please call Father Owen or Fr. Matthew. Godparents must be confirmed and be active members of the church and attend Mass regularly.

### Sacrament of Reconciliation

Every Saturday at 8:15 – 8:45 and 4:45 – 5:15 (or by appointment with Fr. Owen or Fr. Matthew).

### Sacrament of Marriage

Please contact Fr. Owen or Fr. Mathew and set up an appointment. Any Catholic couple needs approximately a year to prepare for the Sacrament of Marriage, which includes sessions with the Priest celebrating the marriage and attendance at Pre-Cana conferences.

### Sacrament of the Sick / Hospital Visits

At St. Rose we are strongly committed to the spiritual care of the sick. Because of privacy laws, hospitals and nursing homes are not allowed to release the patient's religious affiliation. Therefore, we must depend on families of our sick parishioners to inform us of their whereabouts and condition. Please notify the parish office of any need for a home or hospital visit.

### RCIA

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is a program for people who seek full initiation in the Catholic Church through the reception of the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation, which are received at Easter Vigil.
