EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTER

Hurry, hurry! Drive the fire truck!! This week, the Pre-Kindergarten classes got to pretend we were fire fighters! We dressed up in turn-out coats and helmets and put out "fires" all over our classroom with our "hoses" We learned about fire dynamics and did an experiment that showed us how air affects fire. It was REALLY exciting, but we observed from our seats to keep ourselves and our classmates safe! We counted some of the many tools that fire fighters use to fight fires and keep people safe.
