Please keep our young people in prayer these next few months as they prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation in April.

As I mentioned at Mass during the weekend, I really had a wonderful time in Vietnam. It was very special to spend this time at my sister Cait's home and to experience firsthand the wonderful work that she does. As Irish Ambassador to Vietnam, Cambodia and Laos, she resides in Hanoi. Her role as diplomat involves the promotion of Irish products, affairs and interests. She also represents the Irish government in helping to alleviate the many landmines in Cambodia and Laos. Under her guidance minorities are given education and Irish universities are being made available for third level students. Through the support of many first world countries, Vietnam has been moved from a third world country into a second world country in these past years. Vietnam and Laos are both Communist countries where freedom of religion is expressed for all. Cambodia is a Capitalist country but with a rather strict dictatorship. The people of Cambodia are still recovering from the dreaded Khmer Rouge regime but again through international aide, are moving forward.

It was great to spend time also with my twin brother Michael and his children Caitrina and James and of course Fintan, my brother from Dublin. We certainly learned a lot and had wonderful new experiences. Southeast Asia is indeed a wonderful place. From the ancient temples in Cambodia to the modern new buildings in Hanoi, I could see a sense of hope in the eyes of the people, a sense of excitement for new beginnings. Certainly, war damaged the lives of so many people in those beautiful countries but now peace and support from first world nations empower the people to use their talents and skills to rebuild their countries. My brother Michael is still enjoying Vietnam and spent several days in Ho Chi Minh City. He's now in the old capital Hue and has commented on the beauty of the rice fields and some small Christian churches dotted throughout the countryside. I've learned how to cook Vietnamese food. It's very light and delicate. I will certainly keep in my prayers the people of Vietnam, Cambodia and Laos, that through the assistance of many first world nations, they will enjoy good lives with education, time for leisure and quality of life.

It is with great pleasure that I welcome Bishop Serratelli as he presides at the 5:30pm Saturday evening Mass. It's always a pleasure to have Bishop visit St. Rose and I appreciate his dedication not only to St. Rose but to each and every parish in our diocese.

## EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTER

In Miss Donna's preschool class, the children are working on learning their shapes and number recognition with games and songs. The children also had fun doing handprints in mittens and talked about the saying, "Cold hands, warm heart". When asked what they thought a "warm heart" meant, one three year old child stated, "It means Jesus loves you".

Miss Casey's class has been working on learning the letters in their name. Students made snowmen with the letters. They also have been finding magnetic letters to spell out their name.

We have also talked about different animals in winter and whether they hibernate or playing the snow. During our lessons, students chose whether they wanted to be an animal that slept all winter or played in the snow; most wanted to play in the snow. We are preparing for next week when we get to live as a polar bear!

In the Pre-K classes, the children were busy being scientists. This week was "Cc" week, so our science activity was related to Color Changing Celery. First we looked carefully at our celery and discovered how water travels through the celery stalk. Next, we decided to see if we could actually see, by changing the color of the water, the water rising through the stalk. We drew pictures in our science journals each day we observed our celery stalks. By the end of the week, our celery leaves changed colors! Prompting the children's excitement over this experiment, we are now trying various objects in different colored water to see what happens. Science is such FUN!
