## *Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord March 25, 2018*



On this Palm Sunday weekend we begin the holiest week of the year. Our holy liturgies of the Triduum help us to relive the Mass of the Lord's Supper, to help us suffer with Christ in the Passion and to rejoice with Christ in His glorious resurrection.

The Triduum incorporates Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Holy Saturday Vigil:

- Mass of the Lord's Supper includes the washing of the feet of the disciples and the remembering of the institution of the Holy Eucharist.
- The Good Friday proclamation of the Passion, Veneration of the Cross and receiving of Holy Communion helps us to realize Jesus is suffering for us. The gift of Holy Communion reminds us that we are people of the resurrection. The evening Stations of the Cross help us to walk with Christ through joy, sorrow, suffering, death and resurrection.
- On Holy Saturday, the lighting of the Paschal Fire, the procession with the new Easter candle leading into the joyful celebration of the Vigil Mass of Easter.

I encourage you, our parishioners, to try to come to the liturgies for Holy Thursday 7:00pm, Good Friday 3:00pm, Living Stations of the Cross 7:30pm, and the Vigil of Holy Saturday 7:30pm. As you are aware, no Mass is allowed on Holy Thursday morning except for the Mass of the Lord's Supper. No Mass is allowed on Good Friday. The faithful receive Holy Communion, which has been consecrated the night before, during the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion. No Mass is allowed on Holy Saturday except for the Vigil Mass which must be celebrated after sunset.

On Holy Thursday morning, Good Friday morning and Holy Saturday morning Deacon Vinny will lead the faithful in Morning Prayer at 9:00am. Fr. Matthew, following the beautiful Polish tradition, will bless the Easter food on Holy Saturday in the school foyer at 11:00am. Please note next weekend our Easter Mass schedule will be: Saturday Easter Vigil Mass celebrated at 7:30pm, our Sunday Masses will be celebrated at 7:30am, 9:15am, 10:30am and 12:15pm. Remember there will be no 7:00pm Mass on Easter Sunday.

I'm very proud of our Youth Ministry team who, with the help of some younger brothers and sisters and under the direction of Lisa Paradiso, will present a beautiful and prayerful Living Stations of the Cross experience. This is a great way for people who have to work to come and worship Jesus, feel His pain and know His love for us. Also, many people who come to the 3:00pm liturgy also attend the 7:30pm Stations of the Cross and in so doing walk the way of the cross with Jesus and to prepare their minds and hearts for the glory of the Resurrection.

As is our tradition, we will celebrate a holy hour on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 8<sup>th</sup> from 2:15pm – 3:15pm in the church. Fr. Matthew will preside at the liturgy and during the time for quiet reflection in front of the Blessed Sacrament, he will be available in the Quiet Room for Confession.

I was honored to have renewed Rich and Terry Truzzolino's wedding vows last Saturday at the Hanover Manor. Fifty years ago they celebrated their marriage at St. Vincent's in Madison. God has blessed them with two wonderful children and three lovely granddaughters. Congratulations to them and their family.

## LENTEN REGULATIONS

**Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of FAST and ABSTINENCE:**  
Those between the ages of eighteen (18) and fifty-nine (59) are obliged to fast, which means that only one full meal is taken on a day of fasting and no meat is to be eaten.

**FRIDAYS of Lent are also days of ABSTINENCE:**  
The law of abstinence requires that no meat be eaten on a day of abstinence.

**Easter Duty:**  
Is the reception of the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist. To fulfill this obligation the time period is from the First Sunday in Lent (February 18th) to Trinity Sunday (May 27th)



Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday are the days called the Triduum. These Holy Days lead us from the remembering of the institution of the priesthood and the Holy Eucharist. This leads us into the sorrow and pain of Christ's suffering and death on Good Friday. Easter Saturday morning begins bleakly, but ends with the joy of the risen Lord.

## EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTER

This week Miss Donna's class worked on fine motor skills by coloring pictures of Community Helpers and Easter symbols. Our religion lesson of God in three persons was symbolized with a Shamrock. We celebrated St. Patrick's Day with some silly Leprechaun shenanigans and each found two gold coins.

Miss Casey's class learned about St. Patrick's Day this week. We talked about who St. Patrick was and what he did. Students also learned about the symbols that represent St. Patrick's Day: shamrocks, pots of gold, rainbows, and leprechauns. Our class had a visit from a leprechaun who left a big mess in our room; he did leave everyone a special treat: We talked about how we would catch a leprechaun. Some suggestions included: gluing the floor, using shiny coins, and a stop sign to attract the leprechaun. Students also worked on their cutting skills. They cut their own designs on scrap paper and followed dotted lines on a worksheet. Our finger muscles are getting super strong!

In the Pre-Kindergarten classes this week, we learned the story of Noah and his faith and trust in God. We also learned about Saint Patrick who also loved and trusted God and taught the people of Ireland all about the Trinity - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit - by using a shamrock!! We had some STEM fun by planning and building leprechaun traps and, although we didn't catch a leprechaun, one snuck into our classroom and left us treats and surprises!! The Children also dressed as leprechauns and brought home their own pot of gold! Also in the Pre-K classes, we began our investigation of the Planets. We discussed what constitutes a planet, we discussed stars and our universe. We learned new songs to help us learn about our planets and we will be taking a trip to the Planetarium to further investigate this subject.
