The Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time August 16, 2015



This Saturday, August 15th, we celebrate my favorite Marian Feast. As we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of Mary our Blessed Mother into Heaven we celebrate the fulfillment of her life on earth and her glorious beginning as our Mother and Queen in Heaven. Mary our Blessed Mother is indeed a wonderful role model for every human being. As a young girl Mary said “yes” to the will of the Lord. 

News from Rome

First of all I would like to wish everyone a Happy Feast of the Assumption. It is hard for me to believe but I have been living in Italy for over a month now. It feels like just yesterday I arrived at the seminary with all my boxes ready to move in. This is my last week of language studies in Verbania and on the 19th I will be returning to Rome, back to the Seminary to reunite with all the other seminarians who went to either Assisi or Siena to take their language classes, as well as those who did not participate in any of the early orientation programs. In total, we will be over 70 new seminarians, or as they call us, New Men.

However, I would like to speak to you about a wonderful experience I had last Friday with the children and counselors at the local oratory, Oratorio San Vittore. I had the privilege to help with their summer camp and interact with all of them, of course, in Italian! This Friday we went on a field trip to a local island called, Isola dei Pescatori, the Fishermen’s Island. This is part of a chain of islands called the Borromean Islands, which are hidden gems often missed by most tourists to the Milan region. Upon arriving on the island, our first stop was to the church of San Vittore to take time to give thanks to God. We then proceeded to have a treasure hunt on the island searching for clues that would help us solve a puzzle. It was a fun time, although sometimes the children were a little rowdy. Finally, we ended our trip dancing the Cotton Eye Joe, which they had never heard before, but I made sure to teach them. Please keep all the children of the oratory, as well as the great Catholic youth that help as counselors, in your prayers as they prepare to return to school. God Bless!
