Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time June 5, 2016



As you read this bulletin I am in the lovely state of North Carolina having celebrated the wedding of Carolyn Stolfi, our parishioner to Matt McCormick. I have known Carolyn for twenty-four years. Her parents Dorothy and Dennis were active members of St. Patrick during my time there. They transferred to St. Rose when I was appointed here. Dorothy is a catechist and a member of the Rosary Altar Society and Dennis is a

member of the Knights of Columbus. Carolyn and her brother James used to serve Mass for me at St. Patrick's. I was so delighted when Carolyn and Matt asked me to prepare them for marriage and to be the celebrant for the marriage. I flew down on Thursday afternoon and my flight returns today, Sunday, at noon. It is so special as a priest to be involved in the life of a child when he or she is in grammar or high school and you keep that connection for their adult life. I often tease the children in our grammar school and Religious Ed that the day will come when they will knock on my door with their significant other asking me to celebrate their wedding. I can't tell you how many moments of joy there are in my life as a priest and witnessing strong, Catholic individuals prepare for a new life and family through marriage. It certainly is one of the highlights.

I've met with the pastors of St. Patrick and St. Vincent schools to discuss the final points in the transition from our school to theirs. Twenty-two of our children are moving to St. Vincent's, eleven children are moving to St. Patrick's, two children are moving to All Saints Academy in Parsippany and one is moving to Our Lady of the Lake in Verona. Fr. Matthew and I will be involved in celebrating school Masses at St. Vincent's and St. Patrick's, helping with confessions, and I will assist Fr. George (Madison) in teaching the 8th graders Religion class. Our next year's 2nd graders will be prepared for First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion in the sending school. However, they will have their retreat here with some extra classes and they will make their sacraments here at St. Rose. Naturally, we will be supporting our children who are moving on to public school and look forward to having them in our Religious Ed Program here.

Our Pre-K 4 celebrated their Moving Up Ceremony this past Friday. Fr. Matthew gave the opening prayer at the delightful ceremony where the little ones sang to their hearts content. We wish them many blessings as they begin school in the big world of Kindergarten.

Thanks to everybody who brought in canned soup for the food pantry in Dover. As I had mentioned, it was planned for a bad weekend – Memorial Day. This coming Friday, June 10th I'm looking forward to celebrating the 8th Grade Graduation Mass. I'm so proud of our eleven graduates. I'll write more about this next week.

News from Rome

This past weekend, the Church celebrated the feast of the Solemnity of Corpus Christi when Catholics all around the world celebrate the true presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. The roots of this feast can be traced back to the Papal Bull issued by Pope Urban IV in 1264 at Orvieto, *Transiturus de hoc mundo*. The reason for this decree can be traced to a Eucharistic miracle that happened just twenty minutes from Orvieto in the town of Bolsena. A Bohemian priest who was on a trip from Prague to Rome was having doubts about the truth of transubstantiation, which is the real presence of Jesus in the Holy Sacrament. While he was celebrating Mass in Bolsena, the Host began to bleed all over the corporal, the white linen cloth placed on the altar under the Chalice and Ciborium, and on the Altar stone itself. Amazed by the miracle, the priest ran to the Cathedral in Orvieto to tell the Bishop and the Pope, who was staying in Orvieto at the time. After investigating the Corporal, the Pope showed it to the people and by Papal Bull declared the feast of Corpus Christi.

Since then, there have been two big Eucharistic processions every year in both Orvieto and Bolsena, both of which I was blessed to attend. It was an easy start from the College to arrive in time for the first Mass in Orvieto where the Corporal is still on display to be venerated by the faithful. I had the opportunity to sit in the choir at the Mass in my cassock and surplice. Unfortunately it was raining so the procession had to be held within the Cathedral, but it was still moving to think this has been happening here for over 700 years. We then drove to Bolsena for an evening Mass where I also sat in the Choir. The procession was about two and a half hours long and included about 50 priests, 100 seminarians, two bishops and two cardinals. We walked from the Church where the Eucharistic miracle occurred to the castle in Bolsena that sits a top tall hill/small mountain and back to the Church. The whole path of the procession was lined with megaphones so that prayers could be continually heard the whole way. Finally, we carried the altar stone, still stained with the blood along the procession.

The most incredible part of the event in Bolsena was to see how many people lined the streets to watch the Blessed Sacrament go by, something that their families have been doing for generations and which they are passing down to their children. They decorate the streets with flowers arranged into beautiful art which no one but the bishop or Cardinal carrying the Blessed Sacrament walk on. At least, not until after the procession when the children begin to play with them. It was a great experience and a wonderful time of prayer, especially as I begin exams, which I will be taking until June 16th. I thank you for your continued prayers during this time of study and I keep you in my prayers.
