The children of our former Academy are well settled at St. Vincent's, St. Patrick's, All Saints, and Our Lady of the Lake. I began my visits to the schools last week. Each morning I greet the children who board the bus for Madison at 7:15am. I'm happy to say they have all made new friends. Last Monday we had a meeting with parents who would like to continue to be leaders of prayer at the 10:30am Mass. We should have this up and running shortly.

On Wednesday September 7th I met with some of the parents whose children are now attending the public schools. I'm pleased to report the children are well settled and happy in their new environment.

Religious Ed began last Sunday. It was a pleasure to visit the children in Cycle 1. Cycle 2 begins this weekend.

Last Thursday evening we had meetings for our 9th and 10th grade Confirmation parents. We look forward to this weekend, September 18th when 10th grade begins. Fr. Matthew will be responsible for 10th grade this year and I know our young people will enjoy his presence in the classroom. 9th grade Confirmation class will begin next weekend, September 25th. I will be responsible for 9th grade. I look forward to interacting with our 9th graders in class.

Last Friday September 16th, we were happy to welcome the Little Way Homeschool Cooperative to our church and school. They are renting the classrooms three Fridays per month. This is a group of approximately fifty Catholic families who will continue to bring approximately 120 children to our church and facility. We began last Friday with 9:00am Mass. The children were involved with reading, serving and singing. Fr. Matthew and I will be available for confessions and to assist in sacramental formation. Their mission is to "raise saints" through excellence in academic education taught both at home and here at St. Rose.

Each Friday that school is in session we will have Eucharistic Adoration from 10:00am – 2:00pm in the Divine Mercy Chapel. Our parishioners are invited and encouraged to join them. Next week some of the moms will speak briefly after each Mass and will be able to say hello after Mass and answer any questions you might have about homeschooling.

Congratulations to Deacon Vinny who celebrated his 15th Anniversary of his Ordination to Diaconate last weekend. Fr. Matthew represented our parish at a beautiful Mass celebrated by Bishop Serratelli. A big thank you to Deacon Vinny and Peggy for all they do for St. Rose.

World Youth Day Reflection by Christina O'Neill

Hi, I am Christina O'Neill from Our Lady of Good Counsel in Pompton Plains. First of all, I would like to thank the Parish of St. Rose of Lima for welcoming my father and I into their group as if we were one of their own. We were so blessed to be apart of their group during the wonderful experience in Kraków. This summer I had the privilege of traveling to Kraków Poland to celebrate World Youth day with nearly 2 million other youths from around the world. My experience was most definitely both spiritually and culturally life changing. Since the meager age of four I had been awaiting my pilgrimage at World Youth Day. Both of my brothers had gone on previous WYDs in Cologne, Germany and Sydney, Australia. They came home with an abundance of treasured memories and experiences from their trips and I could not wait to acquire my own.

One of the most amazing aspects of our journey was the unity between each person, group and country. When we arrived in the city of Kraków, we had to walk through the city center in order to reach our hotel. I could already sense the change of energy when we passed a stage of people dancing and the crowd dancing along to the music. It was as if there were no language barriers because our faith in God was too overwhelming. Faith is the one language without barriers.

Every day our group of twenty eight people celebrated mass in a different church thanks to Fr. Owen and Deacon Michal. This was one of my favorite parts of the pilgrimage because we were able to receive the Eucharist in a beautiful parish built centuries ago each morning. The love for God radiated through each structure in an unimaginable way. Each mass stood out to me in a different way. In the Wawel Castle Cathedral, there was beautiful gothic architecture with numerous chapels. In a local Franciscan parish there was beautiful stain glass windows behind the altar. We also celebrated mass with Papa Francesco on Sunday morning.

The heart of the pilgrimage truly began on Saturday afternoon as we journeyed to the field where we would be spending Saturday night. We only had to walk a couple of miles to the field then picked up our food backpacks for the rest of the day and the next morning. When we got to the field we set up our sleeping quarters using tarp and sleeping bags. Saturday night was the type of night you have to take a mental picture to keep forever. Imagine, candles being handed out during adoration with two million of your peers. It felt unifying and saturated with God's immense love for all of us. The next morning we celebrated mass with Papa Francesco and left for the city center of Kraków. We walked twelve miles, but we had the promise of a comforting destination, unlike the Syrian refugees Pope Francis spoke about over the weekend.

On Sunday, Papa Francesco told us to build bridges instead of putting up walls. During this amazing experience in Kraków an innumerable amount of bridges connected each Catholic at World Youth Day regardless of each person's origin. Each group would greet us with a hello, a smile, and possibly a U. S. A. chant. Those simple greetings were bridges. My hope is to live out the world youth day mentality of friendliness, peace, and faith as well as follow through with Papa francesco's call to build bridges with our neighbors. I am so thankful for all of the people who contributed to make my World Youth Day experience possible. This pilgrimage opened my eyes to the world and strengthened my relationship with Jesus Christ.
