*Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time October 9, 2016*



This weekend we celebrate Vocation Awareness week. As you are well aware, there are many vocations but this weekend I want to write about the Vocations of Diaconate and Priesthood. The greatest gift God has given me is the gift of my priesthood. Almost 25 years after my ordination, I'm still in awe that the Lord chose me to be a priest. It is a great responsibility and also a great honor and privilege. I so enjoy mentoring the young men that Bishop Serratelli and Fr. Hubert have entrusted to my care. Alex of course is our own homegrown vocation. I hope and pray that more young men from St. Rose will consider the call to priesthood. Moms and dads and grandparents too, please pray for and encourage your sons and grandsons to consider the possibility of God's call for them to the priesthood.

Let's keep our following young deacons and seminarians in prayer and thought as they prepare for the gift of priesthood:

- Deacon Michal is a Transitional Deacon who has been called to the priesthood by our bishop. His Ordination to the Priesthood will take place in the summer of 2017.
- Deacon Andrew who was ordained a Transitional Deacon on September 29<sup>th</sup>. He also is called to the priesthood by our bishop. His Ordination to the Priesthood will take place in the summer of 2017.
- Seminarian Alex who began his second year of Theology in Rome, through the grace of God, we hope that Alex will be ordained a Transitional Deacon in September 2018 and ordained a priest in the summer of 2019.
- Seminarian Kamil completed his studies for the priesthood in Poland. I am mentoring him each Friday thru Sunday. We hope he will be ordained a Transitional Deacon in the summer of 2017.

Some people are confused between a Transitional Deacon and a Permanent Deacon.

- Transitional Deacon – To be ordained a priest, a young man must complete two years of college and have a degree in the studies of Theology, Scripture, Morality, and Canon Law, this takes an additional four years. The young man, at the discretion of the bishop, is ordained a Transitional Deacon for a minimum of six months before he is ordained a priest. The candidate for Diaconate in the Rite of Ordination makes the vow of obedience to his local bishop and his successor and makes the vow of celibacy.
- Permanent Deacon – A married man, with the permission and support of his wife, must complete four years of part time studies to be ordained a permanent deacon. If his wife dies, he cannot remarry. If he is not married at the time of his Ordination to Diaconate, he must remain celibate. Normally, the Permanent Deacon and his wife are very involved in the local parish. Deacon Vinny and Peggy make a great team. While Vinny is an ordained cleric, he cannot celebrate Mass, hear confessions, or anoint the sick or dying. He can preside at a baptism, a wedding ceremony, a wake, a burial rite, and assist the priest at Mass.

Please keep our four candidates in prayer and join me as together we continue to pray that more young men from St. Rose will listen to the voice of the Holy Spirit.

As we celebrate Columbus Day weekend, I welcome all who come to celebrate our great Italian heritage. I'm privileged to celebrate at the 10:30am Mass this weekend and to have a special place in the parade.

**World Youth Day Reflection by Deacon Michal**  
 "Those who believe are never alone."

Every day we are repeating the prayer "Our Father". Are we aware that millions of people around the world are doing the same thing – they are calling God their father? So World Youth Day can be called a meeting of our one big family. For me it was a great experience: getting to know my brothers and sisters from around the world. It is so beautiful, that even though we do not know each other, we have the same goal: to meet God. At that time, the language barrier was not a problem: open heart and helping hand were more important!

These important days took place in the Year of Mercy. The patron of the World Youth Days was St. John Paul II and St. Faustina Kowalska. Can you imagine a better place for the meeting of young people from all over the world, than Krakow? This city still is so connected with St. John Paul II and St. Faustina. Every day we felt the presence of these two great Apostles of the Divine Mercy.

We visited the Wawel Cathedral in Krakow - the most important church of the city, where Karol Wojtyla worked. In this cathedral we had the opportunity to feel the history of Poland: the tombs of Polish kings and bishops, beautiful paintings and most of all, the tomb of St. Stanislaw - the patron of Poland.

We were also in Wadowice, the hometown of Karol Wojtyla - Pope John Paul II. A great experience we had was the prayer at the baptismal font at which Karol Wojtyla was baptized. We also visited his house where now there is a beautiful museum.

We were also in the district of Krakow - Lagiewniki. This is the place where the holy Faustina lived. We can call this place the capital of the Divine Mercy. Here - through the intercession of St. Faustina - we prayed for mercy for the whole world.

Of course, a great and unforgettable experience was the meeting with Pope Francis. I cannot find words to describe my feelings after the Stations of the Cross. I was most touched during the last meeting with the Pope: Mass at the conclusion of World Youth Day. This mass Fr. Owen concelebrated with many priests from around the world, and I could distribute Holy Communion. Can you imagine two million faithful gathered at a Mass? Two million who listen to the Peter of our times – the Holy Father?

I also want to thank all those who in any way helped us to experience this beautiful time. I thank all who have supported us with their thoughts and prayers, words and deeds. Thank you all for everything!

In each place we visited, we met with the kindness of the encountered people, that we are not like strangers, but we have the same Father. I believe that this experience will be with us for many years.

## EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTER

The children in the Pre-Kindergarten classes did several experiments with colors. They learned the primary colors are red, yellow and blue. We mixed these colors in several ways to demonstrate what happens when you mix 2 primary colors-you get secondary colors! The children became scientists and had to discover on their own what happens when you mix these colors. Miss Lorie and Miss Valerie painted the child's hand 2 primary colors, one on each hand, and the children rubbed their hands together to create the new color. The next experiment had the children using tie dye. The children used an eye dropper to decorate a T-shirt with the primary colors. We will wear these decorated shirts during "Tt" week in the spring.

The preschool classes focused on the changing seasons from Summer to Fall. The children discussed the change in their clothing according to the change in the weather. The classes discussed the weather and how it is getting colder and the days are getting shorter. The children also noticed the changes occurring outside by looking at the leaves and how they change as well as the temperature

This has been an exciting week here in Rome, the Deaconate Ordinations. It is always a busy time, but this year was a bit more special than last since two out of the thirty men ordained were from the Diocese of Paterson. And even more special, one of them is our very own Rev. Mr. Andrew Burns. The ordination was lovely, and His Eminence Sean Patrick Cardinal O'Malley, Archbishop of Boston was the ordaining prelate. The whole event took place in St. Peter's Basilica at the Altar of the Chair.

What was very unique though is that Rev. Mr. Andrew's father is a permanent deacon in the Diocese of St. Petersburg. The reason for this is that at a certain point during the liturgy, a member of the clergy comes and vests you with the stole and dalmatic for the first time. Usually it is a close priest or deacon friend, but for Rev. Mr. Andrew, it was his father. Further, at Rev. Mr. Andrew's Mass of Thanksgiving, where he served as a Deacon for the first time, he wore the dalmatic that his dad was ordained in.

I ask that you join me in congratulating him for having reached this great milestone on his journey to the priesthood as well as keep him in our continued prayers as he finishes off this last year before, God-willing, his priestly ordination in the Diocese. I ask that we thank Rev. Mr. Andrew's parents for the gift they have given to the Church of their son. And finally, we give thanks to God for having given us the gift of Rev. Mr. Andrew's ordination.
