### NEWS FROM ROME

Hello again from Rome. I am finally back to my normal schedule after two very interesting weeks. I had the wonderful opportunity after my time in the Holy Land to journey through the first two Christian nations, Georgia and Armenia. While being in Georgia was a wonderful experience, and allowed me to see where many Saints were sent into exile, it was Armenia that I found very interesting. This was particularly the case in regards to the Armenian genocide. I know in the United States the movie *The Promise* has recently come out in theaters, and while I have not been able to watch it over here yet, I have heard great things about it. Most of the Armenians killed during the genocide were actually Catholic and it was interesting to hear the Armenian Catholic, one of the Eastern Churches in communion with Rome, Bishop speak about it. These men, women, and children were truly martyrs for the faith and left behind an incredible example of what it means to suffer for Christ. They could have easily avoided torture and death if they became Muslim, but they knew that it was worth suffering for His name, the same faith they professed since the year 301. This was especially powerful after leaving the Holy Land, where Jesus first suffered for us. I pray that we can always follow the example of those individuals who wouldn't give up their faith, even when encountering difficulty and trials in front of us.

On a happier note, we just had our Rector's Dinner last week which occupied most of my time. It is the main fundraiser for the seminary, and every seminarian has a role to play. It is always a good skill for priests to know how to fundraise. Further, it is a great experience in hospitality and seeing how every small job is important for making the whole thing work. In a real way, it is like the kingdom of God, we might not all play the biggest part, but without each little part the whole suffers. However, when everyone is there, the whole is glorified even greater and rejoices. I keep you always in my prayers, especially those in college who I know will begin their final exams, if they haven't already started.

### LIFE'S CORNER DID YOU KNOW?



Our Lady of Guadalupe is the Patroness of the Unborn. She appeared to Juan Diego, Dec. 12, 1531. She wore a dress of gold threads embroidered flowers of 8 petals which represent hills, the highest points of encounter between God and people.

The only 4-petal flower on the womb just below the sash in the center means Life and movement. The sash tied in a high position around the waist; symbol of pregnancy. End of dress rolled back over the sleeves, white fur means nobility, dressed in Jewish nobility. Her hands joined in prayer of supplication, therefore, not a goddess; there is someone greater than she is. Red birder – the color of rising sun – new life! God Bless ALL LIFE.

Respect Life Committee

Planting and Growing was the theme this week in Preschool! Mr. Mike's Class investigated growing flowers and vegetables. After learning all about what plants need to survive, we planted two types of vegetables in our root farms. One is orange and is a root vegetable and one is green and grows on a plant! Can you guess what they will grow to be? We're excited to check in and watch these seeds become beautiful living things.



Miss Lorie's class did a STEM exploration of the metamorphosis of a caterpillar to butterfly. The children each got a chance to be wrapped in toilet paper to represent a caterpillar who has begun its transformation into the chrysalis. The children then broke out of their chrysalis and became beautiful butterflies. The children also created the stages of the life cycle of the butterfly by cutting out a leaf and putting on a mini marshmallow to represent the egg on a leaf. Next, the children created a caterpillar out of cherrios and a pipe cleaner. The third stage is the chrysalis, the children formed their chrysalis with play-doh.
