Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time November 12, 2017



Do you remember the old Catholics saying “The family that prays together stays together”? Growing up in a strong Catholic family, my parents led us in daily prayers. Consequently we learned to know and love the basic Catholic prayers which I still pray today. As you are aware, the Catholic parent, when they present their child for Baptism, makes a promise to God to teach their children the practice of their faith. This involves ensuring their child goes to Mass on a weekly basis, goes to confession once or twice a year or more if necessary and knows how to pray. Several years ago we began an examination in Religious Ed to ensure the children knew the basic Catholic prayers – the Sign of the Cross, the Our Father, the Hail Mary and the Glory Be. I’m happy to say many of our children knew these basic prayers. Some sadly did not because their parent/parents never taught them therefore they didn’t have the practice of praying as a family. Last September our bishop put into effect an examination of prayers and basic Catholic knowledge so that our children and young people would be able to practice their faith properly. I applaud our bishop with this act of courage on his behalf. As I often say, I’m responsible for the soul of every person in East Hanover and for every parishioner who lives outside our town. My role is to ensure that we strive to live in a state of grace and live according to the norms of the Holy Roman Catholic Church.

We have incorporated a series of tests into our Religious Ed program so that we can best support the children in the knowledge of our faith. The Mass tickets, coupled with the practice and living of our faith help me to support the parents in building a Christian foundation for our children.

We have begun a series of tests for 10th graders to ensure that they too are familiar with the Sign of the Cross, the Our Father, the Hail Mary, the Glory Be, the Apostles Creed, the Act of Contrition and the prayer for the deceased. I again invite and encourage the parents of our Confirmation students to pray with your children the basic Catholic prayers on a regular basis so that our young people will have the gift of prayer for years to come.

As I mentioned last weekend, our ECC toddler room is now complete. We’re taking applications at this time for children from 12 months until 2 ½ years old. I encourage parents with little ones to come and see our wonderful educational environment where our toddlers will be nurtured in a strong Catholic environment and taught age appropriate socialization. At this time we have limited space available for Pre-K 3 and Pr-K 4. 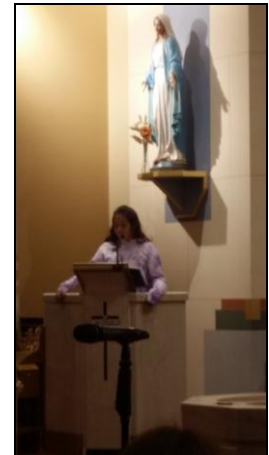

EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTER

The Pre-Kindergarten classes celebrated All Saints Day by making banners and having a parade through our school. The children also used their small motor skills to play several thematic games. They used tweezers to place pom-poms into a pumpkin ice cube tray, they used play doh to create numbers and letters, and they played games of throwing balls into numbered cups. We also began discussing the First Thanksgiving and why we celebrate Thanksgiving. We are also making a new class book to share with the class about being thankful and what that means to us. Our week concluded with First Friday mass, music with Mr. Dave and learning about Jesus, the Good Shepherd in religion!

In Miss Donna's Preschool class, the children explored shapes and painted a black circle. The circle will be used for a frame of our fall tree collages. We are also learning a song about Jesus to sing at church. The children were also busy building structures with blocks and learning about shapes. The children also learned the nursery rhyme "Star Light Star Bright" and colored a picture of a star.

In Miss Casey's Preschool class, the children began talking about Thanksgiving and learned what it means to say thank you. Students shared who we can say thank you to and what we can say thank you for. The next couple weeks we will continue to talk about being thankful, the story of Thanksgiving, and the food we eat for Thanksgiving dinner. Students made scarecrows and Thanksgiving minions for their friends to see. We also began working on numbers 1 through 10. Students practiced identifying numbers and counting pictures to represent those numbers; students followed directions and colored the number of pictures they were told. We are concentrating on recognizing numbers and being counting superstars. Miss Casey's friends have been super busy!
