I'm back folks! I had an amazing trip with my sister and family. I'll tell you all about it next week.

Our Antioch began this Saturday morning and our young people will complete the retreat Sunday after the 4:00pm Mass. I'm very grateful to the adults who guided our team leaders. Our team leaders have worked hard since last summer to prepare for this retreat. Many of them give an inspiring talk that provides our 10<sup>th</sup> graders an opportunity to talk and share experiences. Naturally these experiences are Christ centered. Our goal is to prepare our 10<sup>th</sup> graders to open their hearts to the Holy Spirit in preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Antioch is one part of the three part process for Confirmation; the other two being the academic part. Naturally learning our faith is imperative to the practice of our faith. The other part being the outreach necessary so that our young people understand that as Catholics we must all do works of charity and reach out to those in need. This weekend is always a weekend of enthusiasm and a great opportunity for our young people to really get to know each other in a Christ centered way. Please keep our 10<sup>th</sup> graders in prayer during these final weeks leading up to Confirmation.

Monday we celebrate the holiday of Martin Luther King. It's important for us to remember that all people are created equally by God and that we, for our part, must treat all people with the love of Christ. Looking back at history many people were either enslaved or came to this country with limited education and limited knowledge of the English language. These people, the immigrants, from the early 1800's until the mid 1900's are the people who changed the landscape of our country. They built our bridges, they worked in the mines, they worked in the big factories often times working long hours with limited income. Though their income was small they gave back to our country, became proud Americans and helped to ensure their children had better prospects. We as Americans of the year 2018 are blessed with many choices. We must make choices centered on God's will for us and ensuring that we who love America try our best to keep God's image alive in our land. By the way we live our faith, by the way we care for others especially the marginalized, we portray our loving God. Let's never allow ourselves to be prejudice, to put people in categories or to speak disrespectfully about a person, their faith or their ethnic background. In the early years of the Christian community all were welcome to be baptized. By the way we live our lives we can entice others to understand our faith, our values and hence seek to be baptized into the faith we profess.
